## **Guidance On Safe Bowling**

Bowling balls are heavy.

Grip them firmly using the three holes provided.

Ball returns at speed.

Keep your fingers away from the ball return flap.

Never put your hand in the ball return track.

The lanes are covered in oil and are very slippery.

When bowling never go beyond the foul line at the beginning of the lane.

If a ball gets stuck call for a member of staff to assist

If you spill any food or drink please tell a member of staff immediately it can make the floor very slippery. First aid kid is available.
